KS3/4: Ecosystem Preservation - Geographers study the importance of preserving ecosystems and biodiversity, recognising the intrinsic value of all living things and the interconnectedness of life on Earth.

KS4: Health Disparities - Geographers analyse how factors like socioeconomic status, race, and location can influence access to healthcare and health outcomes. This highlights the importance of ensuring that all individuals have the opportunity to live healthy lives.

KS3 Environmental Rangers: Our Local Community - Exploring how people can work together to address local issues (e.g., neighbourhood clean-ups)

KS3/4: Spatial Inequality - Explore how wealth, poverty, and opportunity are unevenly distributed. Examining the disparities, and how solidarity can bridge this gap.

KS4: International Cooperation - Discuss the importance of international cooperation in addressing global challenges, such as climate change and pandemics.
