SUBJECT SAINT: ST BEDE

KS3: Medieval peasantry, social divisions during the Industrial Revolution, the Impact of the British Empire globally.

KS4: Elizabethan England and the Poor Laws, American West and the destruction of the Indians Way of Life, Medicine and Public Health improvements.

KS3: Changes made during the Norman Conquest, the reformation, the Industrial Revolution, the growth of the British Empire.

KS4: Changes migration brought to America for the native americans, Medical developments and impact globally. Pupils are encouraged to question the impact of these changes and challenge whether or not they were for the common good.

All events and subjects studied in History link to the need to care for God's creation. From farming in Medieval England, to protecting the vulnerable in Nazi Germany, from the impact of the Industrial Revolution, to the devastation of war. Pupils are continually encouraged to reflect on the need to protect and look after our planet and each other.

KS3: The Land of the Free and Holocaust units focus on genocides.

KS4: The American West and Nazi Germany also focus on persecution and genocide of minority groups.

These units teach pupils about the steps to persecution and the importance of learning from these lessons to protect the sanctity of human life.

The role of war in uniting Nations and supporting each other through conflict.

Medicine and developments over time, sharing knowledge and resources, to support all people globally.

KS3: The Mughal Empire, Slavery, the Holocaust, WW1 and WW2
KS4: The American West, Medicine in Britain. These topics encourage pupils to
challenge and question the behaviour of others and to appreciate and respect
the brave actions of others in the past.

KS3: Life in Medieval England and during the Industrial Revolution, highlighting the struggles endured and the actions of some to bring about equality at work. Living conditions for enslaved people. Suffrage.

KS4: Elizabethan England, class structures and slavery, migrants in the American West.
