MFL helps our pupils understand how poverty, inequality, and environmental concerns affect people in French / German and Spanish-speaking countries. In the GCSE curriculum we discuss poverty and voluntary work in the future. Pupils learn how to talk about which issues are worrying to them and why it is important to help others. We support pupils to take action to do charity work and think of others before themselves.

We encourage pupils to express their opinions as well as listen and respect one another.

We teach the pupils to learn to listen and value all opinions.

We discuss environmental and global issues in our GCSE curriculum and how we can combat these. We talk about the importance of caring for the world and how our actions can have an impact on global problems.

MFL equips students with the language skills to engage in meaningful conversations with people from diverse backgrounds. We discuss relationships, both familial and amicable.
